Noam Chomsky is a revolutionary thinker whose linguistic works include *Syntactic Structures* (1957) and *Knowledge of Language* (1986). Noam was an early critic of the Vietnam War. His political works include *American Power and the New Mandarins* (1969), *Manufacturing Consent* (w/E. S. Herman, 1988), and *Rogue States* (2000). His works on democracy include *Deterring Democracy* (1992) and *Failed States* (2007). Noam is preparing a book addressing “Extinction or Internationalism.”



Wallace Shawn is an Obie Award-winning playwright and a noted stage and screen actor. He is co-author of the movie *My Dinner with Andre* and author of the plays *Marie and Bruce*, *The Fever*, *Aunt Dan and Lemon*, *The Designated Mourner*, and *Grasses of a Thousand Colors*. His nonfiction collection *Essays* (Haymarket Books) is out now in an expanded paperback edition featuring “Why I Call Myself a Socialist.”
